Ward Street Drainage Works Update

We're making great progress on the Ward Street drainage works, aimed at addressing long-standing issues with water retention and ponding. The location was identified as reaching the end of its lifecycle, primarily due to various utility works that have impacted the stability of the kerb.

To minimise disruption and stay within available funding, we focused on prioritising localised sections of the street. This includes the renewal of a 20m culvert (pipe) and the replacement of up to four sumps. We're pleased to report that all drainage work is expected to be completed ahead of schedule and before schools reopen.

Once the drainage work is finished, the next phase will involve surface repairs to improve the shape of the carriageway, particularly in the eastbound direction. These repairs will resolve poor reinstatement issues that were caused by previous work in 2017.

To keep the community informed, a letter drop was carried out a week before the work began, and we are planning further communications as the project nears completion.

Thank you for your patience as we continue to enhance Ward Street and ensure a better, safer road for all.

Five pedestrians injured after being hit by a car on Fergusson Drive near **Islington Street**

Five pedestrians were hit by a car, during a car crash, shortly before 1.45 pm on Saturday afternoon.

Four people were taken to hospital. Two to Hutt Hospital, one in a serious condition and one in a mild condition. The other two were taken to Wellington Hospital in mild conditions. The fifth person was treated at the scene.

Fire and Emergency have said that two cars were involved in the crash, and a power pole had been hit as well as the pedestrians.

Fergusson Drive is currently blocked, and detours are in place for those heading to and from the races today.

Fleeing driver sentenced to 23 months in jail after hitting police officer deploying road spikes

James Wiki Henry was sentenced to 23 months in jail in Wellington District Court on Tuesday. Charges laid included endangering transport, driving while forbidden, failing to stop to ascertain injury, failing to remain stopped, reckless driving, and several counts of shop lifting.

The offending happened in January last year, where he rammed a police car after road spikes were being laid while fleeing police. He used Z-spikes to deflate the tires of two other police cars that were pursuing him, until he fled his vehicle and was caught in Silverstream.

The incident is similar to that which resulted in the death of Senior Sergeant Lyn Fleming in Nelson. The police officer in this incident didn't die from the injuries, but it did lead to them leaving the police

Attempted robbery at Redwood Dairy on Sunday morning

The Redwood Dairy faced an attempted robbery on Sunday morning (19th of January), just after 10.00 am. A man came in asking if they stock band aids, when told no, he left the store but came back shortly afterwards wearing a mask and threatening the man operating the store at the time, Jugvinder, with a metal bar. Jugvinder chased after the offender with a stick, and the man fled. They had CCTV operating and gave the security footage to the police, who arrived 15 minutes later.

His wife, Manmeet said that "They (the offenders*) might be coming from a bad background or they have a sad story from their family or their childhood was something traumatic. That is all secondary ... they're robbing us and it's not okay."

Upper Hutt City Council have issued Andy Bell, and Ganson Group, the property managers of The Mall, consent to demolish the Criddles Curtains building on Queen Street, which has been suffering from mould, plants growing through the floors, and weather-tightness issues. The building also includes the old Pet Centre, and what was United Video. The mall had applied for consent for demolition back in October, but the council wanted more information on the impact this would have on Monterey Cinemas which is next door.

The property managers have plans to build a 2,500 m2 retail building in the space between Logan Street and the back of Monterey Cinemas, and they are now arranging to lock in a date for the demolition to begin.

I know that I put up an article about the use of AI generated images a couple of months back but I thought I'd put up this revised edition of it. Things have changed somewhat, and I thought I'd make it clear when I use AI images and when I don't.

- If an article has a photo or image included with it, I'll use the image provided.
- If no image or photo is provided, or if I feel it's inappropriate, then I'll use an AI generated image.
- If privacy is required, like for a school protecting students identities, then I'll use an AI generated image.
- If the AI program can't generate the image I'm looking for (there are some things which it doesn't seem to get, like carrot cake. Where it showed a cake with literal carrots on it!), then I'll get the image from pixabay.com or pexels.com)
- I'll only be using AI image generation on The Upper Hutt Connection. I won't use AI for creating articles, video creation, etc.

Lastly, I've recently signed up to a paid AI image generation software. This produces much higher quality images than previously, and better editing options. Below is a comparison of what I was able to do before with the skate park scene and what it was able to give me now.

Upper Hutt United Cricket Club's Premiere Mens team takes the Hazlett one day trophy, beating Petone-





The Upper Hutt Connection



Ingredients:

- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 150g button mushrooms
- 1/2 red capsicum, diced
- 250-300g cooked chicken
- 25g butter
- 2 tbsp flour
- 2 cups milk
- 1 tsp garlic salt
- 1/2 cup grated cheese

Method:

- Fry onion in a little oil, in a large frying pan. While the onion is cooking, prepare and add the following ingredients – Mushrooms, capsicum, and cooked chicken.
- In a large saucepan, melt the butter over a medium heat, and when melted stir in the flour.
- 3. Add 1 cup of the milk to the butter mixture, and stir constantly until it boils and thickens. Then add the other cup of milk, stirring constantly, until the sauce boils again.
- 4. Stir in the garlic salt and the grated cheese, then add the cooked vegetables and chicken into the sauce, and stir together.
- Serve with pasta, rice, potato wedges, or on toast.

Potato Wedges

Ingredients:

- 5 6 potatoes. Agrias work well.
- Olive oil
- Seasoning (optional)

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 220°C
- 2. Cut each potato into quarters, and then cut each quarter in half, making 8 wedges.
- As you prepare each wedge of potato, dry it with a tea towel, and then brush with olive oil using a pastry brush. You can add salt, pepper, garlic salt, or other seasonings to the olive oil if you wish.
- Arrange the wedges in a large roasting pan, and bake in the top area of the oven for 30 minutes.


