

Postal History Corner: Hayward's Post Office

The Hayward's Post Office opened on 14 December 1903 and closed on 28 February 1923.

Although the district was known as Haywards, the post office had an apostrophe in the name.

The railway station at Haywards on the Wellington – Hutt Valley line came into service in 1876. Although the population in the area was sparse it was of importance through being the only designated crossing station between Upper Hutt and Lower Hutt. The need for postal facilities was satisfied with the opening of a post office in the station building in 1903. was demolished and replaced by a "shelter shed", as the photograph taken in 1953 shows. The rural character of the area is depicted in the background.

Post Office business was minimal, and the salary of the Postmaster was paid by the Railways. The office transferred from railway control on 30 September 1922 with the appointment of Charles Neave who was paid £5 (\$10) per annum. It was likely that the post office transferred to a nearby resident's home.

Only one postmark is recorded as being used at Hayward's and examples are scarce. Recorded from 4 Oct 1904 until 23 Jun 1913.

Are there more envelopes and postcards that were mailed from Hayward's waiting to be discovered to record further dates of usage?

An article in the New Zealand Mail date 4 May 1904* describes the train journey from Petone to Upper Hutt and Haywards station as being "situated at the outlet of Judgford Valley, the scenery hereabouts being somewhat similar to that surrounding Belmont".Source – https://paperspast.natlib.govt.nz/newspapers/NZMAIL19040504.2.130?

It describes Belmont as "bush clad terraces, verdant gluches and green nooks has become an attractive spot for picnics and junketings"

The council is seeking your feedback on their review of the **Prevention of Nuisance from Fires** and Smoke Bylaw: Consultation ends 27th of November 2025

Prevention of Nuisance from Fires and Smoke **Bylaw Review and Proposed Updates**

Council is reviewing its Prevention of Nuisance from Fires and Smoke Bylaw, and we need your feedback

This review is required under the Local Government Act 2002, and we're also proposing two updates to make the bylaw clearer and more transparent.

Your views will help Council decide whether to keep the bylaw and adopt the proposed updates.

Consultation is open 22 October - 27 November 2025 (5pm)

Why We Have a Fire and Smoke Nuisance Bylaw

This bylaw protects the public from the nuisance caused by smoke, noxious fumes, or uncontrolled fires - except for fire safety issues, which are managed by Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) under the Fire and Emergency New Żealand Act 2017.

The bylaw:

- Prohibits fires, smoke, or fumes that create a nuisance, health risk, or safety risk to any person or property (excluding fire safety issues covered by FENZ).
- Allows Council officers to take reasonable steps to abate (reduce or stop) the nuisance - including requiring a fire to be extinguished.

Allows Council to recover costs if it must take action.

This approach is more practical than relying on voluntary compliance or going through the District Court under the Health Act 1956. It also provides officers with the tools to respond quickly and maintain community safety.

What the Bylaw Does

The bylaw makes it an offence to:

- Light or allow to remain lit a fire that creates a nuisance, health risk, or safety risk to any person or property.
- Allow smoke, noxious fumes, or other matter to be emitted in a way that creates a nuisance, health risk, or safety risk.

If required, authorised officers can:

- · Direct a property owner to extinguish a fire.
- Enter property without notice if immediate action is needed (under the Health Act 1956).
- Take reasonable steps to stop or remove the nuisance.

Serious fire safety risks are referred to Fire and Emergency New Zealand; environmental pollution risks are referred to Greater Wellington Regional Council.

How the Bylaw Has Worked So Far

- 235 fire and smoke nuisance requests were made to Council between June 2019 and April 2025.
- Most complaints were resolved with warnings and voluntary extinguishing of fires.
- From September 2023 to April 2025 (89 complaints):
 - 55% were about burning rubbish or toxic materials.
 - 20% were about outdoor fires or bonfires.
 - 12% were general concerns about smoke or fire.

Officers have not yet needed to extinguish fires forcibly, as people have complied when asked.

Proposed Updates to the Bylaw

The bylaw is fit for purpose and remains the most appropriate way to deal with nuisance from smoke and fire.

We're proposing two small updates to make it clearer and more transparent (these do not create new rules):

1. Full definition of "nuisance"

Currently, the bylaw only refers to the Health Act 1956. We propose to include the full text of section 29(m) and (n) so the public can see exactly how "nuisance" is defined.

2. Add a Penalties section (Section 6)

Council already has the power to impose penalties for breaches, but we propose to add a dedicated section so the public clearly understands the potential fines and enforcement powers.

These changes bring the bylaw in line with Council's Public Places Bylaw 2005 and increase transparency.

Friends of Mawaihakona Stream

What's going on at Mawaihakona Stream?

Stage Two of the land development adjacent to the stream has begun.

This involves raising the land up to circa 3m within the bund (embankment) currently being built back to the Stage One land that has already been raised.

Presently, an existing sewer line is being upgraded prior to the infill commencing.

The rest of the paddock between the bund and the river trail will be excavated to an average depth of 1.5m and used as fill for the land being raised. The topsoil will be set aside and spread/grassed, recreating the flood plain area capacity.

The power and gas lines that run across the paddocks will not be disturbed.

The stream track on the side adjacent to this work will be closed off for safety reasons and will be reopened once the adjacent work is no longer a safety

Once the fill from this paddock area has been removed, the excavation works will move to the other side of the stream, removing an average 1.5m from the paddocks up as far as the formed pathway from Heretaunga Park to the river trail. There will be no encroachment on the planting alongside the stream. Once this work starts, there will be a lot of truck movement.

In early 2026, a temporary bridge will be installed across the ford to avoid damage to the stream. The trucks are not permitted to enter the stream at all.

At this point, there will be no access from one side of the ford to the other. Your path walking will need to be in and back the same way you came. If all goes well and the weather behaves itself, the developers are hopeful of completing this work by mid to late 2026.

Off-limit areas will change as the work progresses.

The haymaker will be doing one more run of grass collection prior to the paddocks being dug up. Just awaiting a run of fine weather!

Working bees to maintain the lower reaches of the stream and prevent it closing up with weed will generally be held on Sundays when the developers are not working.

We are currently looking at putting down base course gravel which will considerably improve the paths in winter weather. This is not a cheap exercise and grant applications are underway to raise the estimated \$20,000 for the complete job. At the earliest, nothing will be happening until the grounds harden up, but we have met with the developers who will enable us to get the materials in as we can afford it.

We are in touch with the project team and will keep you informed as new information comes to light.

Upper Hutt Housing Charitable Trust office opening

Forty-eight main street is the new home of The Upper Hutt Housing Charitable Trust (UHHCT) and Hutt Valley Benefit Education Service Trust, (BEST). It was with a sense of joy and pride that we opened this new office facility on Friday the 10th of October. Guests from other similar Church and service organisations, The Mayor, Council Community Service Group members, the local MP's office, Work and Income, Police and other well wishers joined us in the celebrations.

Both the UHHCT and Best began their work in the Upper Hutt community as a Christian response to poverty and housing deprivation, works of Mercy. The two organisations fit well together as their purpose is to serve the needs of the people who are on the peripheries of our community due to being deprived access to financial independence, limiting their access to basic human necessities such as food, health care, shelter. The Mayor Wayne Guppy opened the facility commending the work of the UHHCT and BEST within Upper Hutt community. He noted that UHHCT was a nominee for the Wellington Airport Upper Hutt community award. Further noting that both UHHCT and BEST had their origins from local Catholic outreach groups. While this is the case UHHCT and BEST have had and have the support of other local Church groups and like minded people of good will who recognise the need of the marginalised and want to help. The chair of the UHHCT and service manager of BEST spoke of their different journeys to the new office of both. The UHHCT was varied, from an office in St Joseph's Church, to a garage in a rental property in Maoribank, to temporary facilities in the old Wallaceville Research complex made available by Malcolm Gillies, then 95B Main Street and now home at 48 Main Street. BEST was run from a house on the property of the Home of Compassion Silverstream then owned by the Compassion sisters, then 95B Main Street and now here. Both organisations are supported by boards committed to the work, friends of the organisations, and funders of not-for-profit groups, without them, there would be no facility to operate from.

The UHHCT seeks new board members who share the trust's Kaupapa To continue operating the trust needs to generate funding so are setting up a dedicated fund-raising group led by a member of the board. We seek as well, sponsors and benefactors with a heart for improving the plight of the vulnerable. 
